These are intended to be "short answer" (key phrases or one sentence) questions! Use a separate sheet of paper for your answers. The questions are generally in the same order as the material in your text book. *Note that question #1 counts 24% of this quiz grade.*

1. Have you read all of the required material in the textbook (pages 117 - 150)?
2. What is the most probable year that Jesus was crucified? Give one of the reasons mentioned in the textbook for that date.
3. How do we know that Jesus' birth was before 0 AD?
4. According to your textbook, why was Jesus baptized in the Jordan River?
5. What town became the center of Jesus' ministry in Galilee?
6. What did Jesus announce in the synagogue of his home town, Nazareth?
7. Give 3 of the 5 methods that Jesus employed to train His followers.
8. In which city did Jesus first reveal to His disciples the suffering He would endure as Messiah?
9. Why did Jesus mention the prophecies of Jeremiah during the last supper?
10. At what time of the day did Jesus die on the cross? How long after that did the Jewish Sabbath begin?
11. In what way did Jesus communicate using a different medium than other famous teachers such as Plato, Aristotle, and Philo?
12. Why did Jesus sometimes use self-contradictory language, such as Matthew 16:25?
13. Give a preface phrase that Jesus sometimes used to convey His divine authority in His teachings.
14. Jesus had much to say about the kingdom of God. What does "kingdom" mean in this context?
15. Give 2 scriptures that together indicate the kingdom of God can be experienced in both the current age and also in the age to come.
16. Give 3 examples that show Jesus was fully human.
17. Give 3 scriptures where Jesus claims (either explicitly or implicitly) that He is God.
18. What was the purpose of Jesus referring to Himself as the "Son of Man"?
19. What was Jesus' approach in confronting sinners who were not self-righteous?
20. Name 4 specific areas of Christ's teachings that are contained in the Nicene Creed.
